GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION

Privacy Policy for Members

For the purposes of the General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") and Guernsey data protection laws, the controller is the Northern Bowling Association (the "Venue") of Delancey Park, St Sampson Guernsey.

About this document

- This privacy policy sets out the way we process your personal data and we've created this privacy policy to make sure you are aware of how we use your data as a member of our tennis venue.
- How we collect your information
- We may collect your personal data in a few limited ways, namely:
- Directly from you, when you fill in an application for membership, when you make enquiries on our website or when you interact with us during your time as a member in various other ways (for example, where you enter a competition, renew your membership or attend social events);
- From someone else who has applied for membership on your behalf (for example a family member or your tennis coach who has provided us with your contact details for that purpose);

The types of information we collect

We may collect the following types of personal data about you:

 Contact and communications information, including your contact details (including email address(es), telephone numbers and postal address(es) and records of communications and interactions we have had with you);

How we use personal data

- Personal data provided to us will be used for the purposes set out at the time of collection and, where relevant, in accordance with any preferences you express.
- More generally, we will use your personal data for the following purposes:
- Administration of your membership
- Circulation of club notices and newsletters
- where this is necessary for the performance of a contract (including any written
- terms and conditions relating to your membership) with you
- Communication about club activities that we think may be of interest to you;
- Storing your details on the club membership database
- For use by members to arrange fixtures
- where this is necessary for our legitimate interests (for example in increasing use of our facilities and participation in the game generally);

We will always respect your wishes in respect of what type of communications you want to receive from us and how you want to receive them. There are some communications, however, that we need to send you in order for us to fulfil our contractual obligations to you as a member of our Venue. Examples of these essential service communications are:

 Membership related mailings such as your membership renewal reminder, notices of formal meetings and information about green closures and holiday opening hours.

Sharing your information with others

We do not sell or share your personal data for other organisations to use.

Personal data collected and processed by us may be shared with the following third parties, where necessary:

- Our volunteers, for the purposes of administering your membership and arranging fixtures.
- Bowls Guernsey Association.

How long your information is kept

We keep your personal data only as long as is necessary for each purpose for which we use it. For most membership data, this means we retain it for so long as you remain a member of the club and for a period of one year after your last interaction with us (unless required to be kept longer for accounting, tax reporting and record - keeping purposes).

Your rights

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:

- Request access to your personal data (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal data we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- Request correction of the personal data that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you corrected.
- Request erasure of your personal data. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal data where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it.
 You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal data where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below)
- Object to processing of your personal data where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also

have the right to object where we are processing your personal data for direct marketing purposes.

- Request the restriction of processing of your personal data. This enables you to ask
 us to suspend the processing of personal data about you, for example if you want us
 to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it. You can also withdraw your
 consent, where this is the basis for our processing your data (without affecting the
 lawfulness of our previous processing based on consent).
- Request the transfer of your personal data to another party.

Please note that the above rights are not absolute, and we may be entitled to refuse requests where exceptions apply.
